Channing Daughters is a project all about artisanal experimentation and sustainability. The vineyards are all worked by hand including canopy management and harvest, and the red grapes are stomped by foot. Light pink in colour, zippy and food friendly, it has won many awards as America's best rose.

Red Wines

Kekfrankos Reserve, Heuman, Villany, Hungary 15.50 22.00

Heumann is only 15 hectares with 90% classified as premium status of the DHC and is organically certified with minimal work in the vineyards to preserve the land for future generations. Kekfrankos blossoms in this part of the wine world and shows the quality of red wines that Hungary can produce. A lesser known variety of Blaufrankisch. Rich, tannic & spicy.

Toscana Rosso, Lenzini, Tuscany 16.00 22.50

Franco restored his family home to its former glory before he changed his focus to the vineyard. In 2007 they switched to organic farming and then in 2010 all the way to biodynamic practices. Biodynamics has completely changed how the wine is made, using the lunar cycles to grow, harvest and bottle with natural elements throughout. This is his top estate blend, showing the best grapes of his property together in one. A fantastic alternative to a classic Bordeaux.

As our contribution to the planet's wellbeing becomes ever more key and our 'thirst' for wines increasingly grows, Mary wanted to bring this concept back with her to the Miller.

Our BIB is 100% Barbera, soft, easy drinking and fruit forward.

Have a glass, a carafe or have the well presented 3 litre box on the table and serve yourselves - maybe the driver can enjoy some later. Who says we have to be snobby about the glass and in the meantime, consider the natural cork we are saving.

About our Cellar Choices

We work with like-minded suppliers to ensure we support local producers where possible, purchase responsibly and encourage sustainability. Due to poor harvests and harsh climatic conditions last year, some wines are subject to availability and may change.

In a world that could crumble, it is important to our bit. From using natural corks and replanting trees to farmers who farm wild meadows, beekeeping and village crowdfunding we support all efforts wherever we can.

We appreciate all levels of sustainability including the new idea of regenerative viticulture and respect anyone who can get up when the lunar moons tell them to! We hope you enjoy our selection and your contribution to the planet through your enjoyment of our wines.

Sustainable, Organic & Biodynamic

We like our planet so why wouldn't we consciously try our best to look after it?

Sustainable

Whilst not certified organic, these wines are made in wineries that are actively adopting best practices to reduce their carbon footprint in a variety of ways - generating electricity, using a natural water source, lighter weight packaging or off-setting via planting projects. They may encourage live-stock to enhance the vineyard, plant trees, protect nearby forests or encourage bees to pollinate the flora and fauna.

Ken Forrester - The Estate is registered ECOSERT for organic certification, and an active participant in the IPW initiative encouraging biodiversity in wine production. Ken is a huge supporter of the local communities and charitable initiatives across South Africa.

Emiliana began its conversion to organic production in 1998, and today 100% of its properties are organically managed. It is the world's largest organic winery. In 2006, Emiliana was the first winery in Latin America to produce a wine with biodynamic certification. Since then, the use of biodynamic practices at its farms and cellars has been accredited and today 100% of its properties are certified. Emiliana received its Fairtrade and Fair For Life certifications in 2011 and 2017, and has been selling fair trade wines since 2012.

Organic

Organic farming and winemaking is becoming more and more popular across with producers of the world. These wines have been certified as being organic to standards defined by law. This covers everything from pesticide use and land management, to preservation and storage.

Biodynamic

Biodynamic winemaking is a leap on from organic wine making. Equally, both wines cannot use pesticides or fungicides on the vineyard however biodynamic winemaking must also not use any synthetic agents and therefore the wine should be expressive of the true grape flavours. This is a very expensive way to produce wine so generally speaking it helps put faith in the wine and entrust that you're drinking a healthier choice-but it may come at a price!

Vegetarian & Vegan Friendly.

Wine is just grapes and yeast right...nearly correct. In reality, wine contains small particles of sediment that would make the wine cloudy. In order to

make wine appealing and aesthetically pleasing filtration and fining usually happens to remove the sediment. Fish bladders and egg whites can be used however we are seeing more vegetable proteins and clay (bentonite) used these days. Phew!

'Healthy Wine'

I think everyone knows, like all great things, wines need to be consumed in moderation but who says we can't choose wines that are healthier for us. We have wines with lower calories, wines without sulphates and wines that contain a higher than average amount of antioxidants so be free of those guilty feelings.

Did I mention that in moderation, rosé wine is said to help reduce cholesterol, contains antioxidants and potassium that contribute to healthy skin and well-being.
